for women addressing domestic abuse. Available are leaflets for new groups across Fife STARTING January 2017. I would be grateful if you would circulate the following information to others who you think would be interested in this information. The Programme is 2 hours per week for 12 weeks and is for any woman who:

Recognises they are/have been in an abusive relationship

Are not fully aware that their relationship is abusive and harmful

Women can attend the groups regardless of their current living situation. It is predominately a course addressing the nature and impacts of domestic abuse, however, it also increases women's confidence, helping to make more positive choices and take back control of lives.
